Dr Fernando is Associate Professor at the Irish School of Ecumenics, Trinity College Dublin, and Director of the Trinity Centre for Post-Conflict Justice. A leading scholar in liberation theology and peace studies, he focuses on faith, conflict, and geopolitics, especially in Sri Lanka and Asia.

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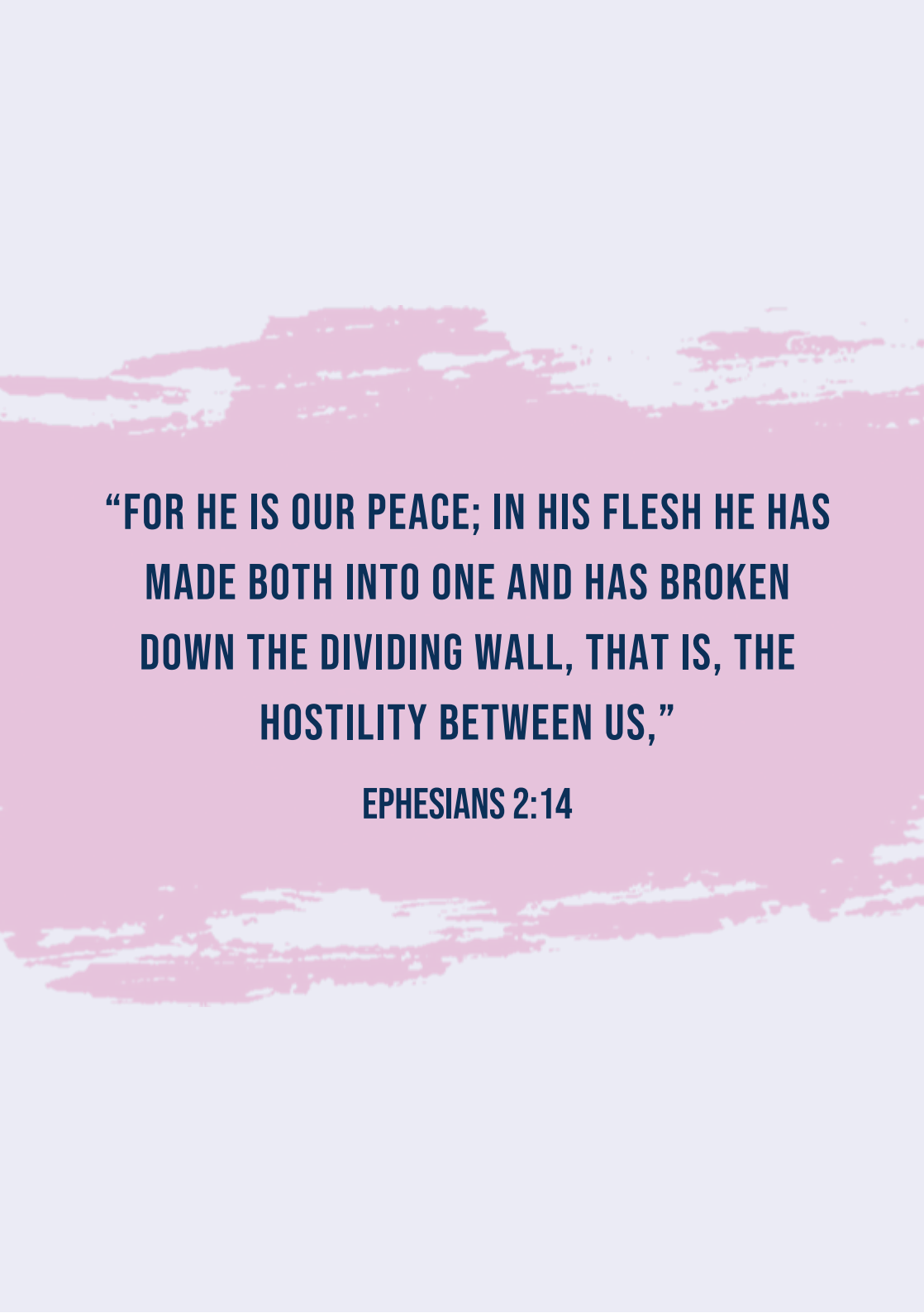


## THE RT REVD LUSA NSENGA-NGOY

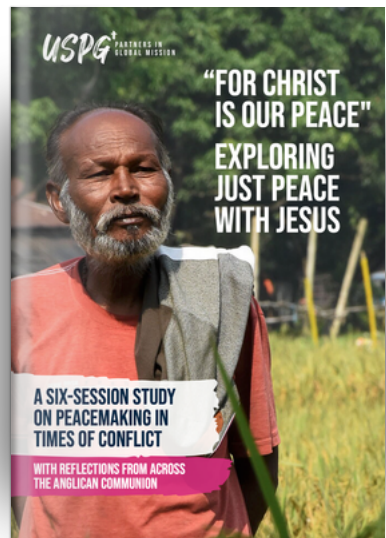
